COURSE DESCRIPTION

The artistic processes of creating, performing, responding and connecting provide unique experiences in self-awareness and personal efficacy to musicians of all ages and abilities. Music educators are well-situated to teach skills and dispositions through music performance, leading to students becoming more competent. The course will prepare music teachers to engage more students through creative processes. Also, students will learn to guide and lead community conversations about the value and benefits of music to students, school and the community.

The course is designed and intended for all musicians: undergraduate and graduate music education and music performance majors, public and private school teachers, and applied lesson instructors.

Students will be able to:

- Review current music education curriculum and explore ways that it addresses the individual learning needs of students
- Perform, compose and improvise music in a variety of genres, instruments, styles and technologies
- Lead rehearsals, classes, applied private lessons with a wholistic approach that meets students' learning needs
- Explore approaches to advocacy for music and arts learning to assure access and equity to music and arts education and strengthen community connections through the arts
