

Rural Hospital Boards Need Strengthening

Strong governance is essential for small and rural hospitals to confront changing dynamics in finance, reimbursement, quality of care and workforce shortages. We surveyed board chairs and chief executive officers (CEOs) at critical access and prospective payment system hospitals (CAH and PPS, respectively).

- Respondents said that **Board membership** requirements are often undefined.
- Only a minority of respondents strongly agreed that board strategic planning is used effectively for hospital operations.
- Many boards lack quality of care / patient safety committees.



Appointment criteria

 Top rural board training needs include strategic planning, board governance responsibilities, third-party reimbursement, and legislative concerns.
